# Faculty Spotlight TERESA DITTMER

## Greetings to the Marquette Community & Happy Spring!

My name is Teresa Dittmer, I am the Agricultural Education Teacher and FFA Advisor here at Marquette Academy High School. First, I want to thank the administration, faculty, staff, parents, and students for welcoming me into the "Marquette Family." I feel blessed to have this opportunity to serve God and my students as we all grow together in His name.

My background and faith assure me that this is my vocation. I grew up on a farm and dedicated the last five years of my life to working full-time at Dittmer Angus. My Catholic faith will always be number one in my life. Having the opportunity to openly practice my faith, pray with my students at the end of every class, and discuss God's role in agriculture (as He is the creator of everything) are some of the most fulfilling moments of my teaching career. My classes have been fortunate enough to participate in many onsite demonstrations and field trips. Initially, Sid Devries came and demonstrated sheep shearing and talked to us about the different uses for wool. Additionally, we visited our FFA Ag plot, met with professional Agronomists, seed salesman, and farmers who planted and harvested our plot. We also milked a dairy cow at Dittmer Angus and used the milk for a "Farm-to-Fork" project. To raise money for FFA, we picked pumpkins and corn stalks to sell as holiday decor. Finally, we attended the National FFA





Convention in October and the Dairy Food Products Career Development Event (CDE) where we placed fourth overall.

This spring our students will have many more opportunities to learn and grow. We are looking forward to attending several more CDE events including veterinary science, public speaking, and livestock judging. We also plan to take part in the Women in Agriculture Conference in March, the Illinois FFA State Convention, and the FFA Leadership Camp. Furthermore, we will embark on more Farm-to-Fork projects, hatch ducklings, sell plants, and visit the IVCC Hemp Greenhouse and the Streator FFA Pig Project. In the fourth quarter, we will explore careers in agriculture with featured experts speaking on "Future Fridays."

I couldn't be more excited to experience my first year teaching at Marquette Academy High School. With its family-oriented environment, it truly feels like home here. I am very devoted to my Catholic faith, so to have the opportunity to express my love for Catholicism, along with my passion for the Agricultural Industry is truly a blessing. At the end of the day, the purest joy I have teaching here at Marquette will always be for my students. The opportunity to grow and learn together with them will always be one of the greatest blessings of my life.
