Required Classes

- Dual Credit Courses are takenat Marquette Academy during the Junior and Senior Years
- Dual Enrollment Courses are taken at IVCC on the Main Campus, Ottawa Center, and/or Online during the afternoon of their senior year. Release time will be granted by Marquette Academy Administrators
- Additional IVCC Online, Evening, and Summer courses during the Junior and Senior years

Admission Criteria Time table

Freshman

- Meet with your high school counselor regarding the admission process
- Earn at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA by the end of your Freshman year
- Both the student and his or her parents discuss the commitment needed to complete the Running Start Program

Sophomore

- Attend a Running Start Informational Night
- Continue earning 3.0 cumulative GPA
- Submit a New Student Enrollment form
- Complete Accuplacer placement tests and score at college-ready level or submit qualifying ACT scores

- Meet with the IVCC counselor and develop plan of study
- Begin taking courses the summer following your Sophomore year in high school

Students are required to meet all college criteria and follow college procedures for enrolling in courses. It is important to be aware that dual credit students are beginning their official college transcript. Grades earned in dual credit classes will be part of the student's permanent collegiate transcript.

Student Advisement

An IVCC Counselor working in cooperation with the Marquette Academy Guidance Counselor will meet with qualified students individually to assist with their plans of study.
